## Boy's Generous Gift to Ailing Neighbor Recognized by GGRCC

Wyatt Erber, an 8-year-old Edwardsville third grader, has received a Good Citizenship Certificate from GGRCC for generously donation a \$1,000 prize to a 2-year-old neighbor suffering from lymphocytc leukemia.

Wyatt, son of Jeff and Noelle Erber, is believed to be the youngest person to have ever received the recognition from the chapter. The certificate was presented to the Columbus School student at a Sept. 24 meeting of the Edwardsville Board of Education..

Wyatt won the \$1,000 prize money from a scavenger contest sponsored by First Clover Leaf Bank of Edwardsville. He said he didn't need the money and wanted to donate it to Cara Kielty, daughter of a neighbor, to help meet expenses of her long-term treatment.

"She was sick and I felt like that was the right thing to do," Wyatt said.

The donation attracted newspaper and broadcast attention to Wyatt from throughout the nation. Edwardville citizens, coordinated by school officials, raised another \$1,000 to match Wyatt's gift.
