I was at the battle of Eutaw Springs, and was in North Carolina in what was called the "truce land", and was engaged in scouting parties against the Tories. I was not discharged from service until after military operations had ceased."

Private: SC. He served under Capt. Wm. Nettles' Company in General Francis Marion's South Carolina troops.

**Burial:** He is buried in the Peebles Cemetery near Chesterfield. A few years since the members of the family erected a monument to the memory of this Revolutionary hero. A bronze marker was placed by the DAR.
